Respiratory Rate Sheet

- 1) Record your pet's respiratory rate (RR) at sleep or at rest.
 - 2) Watch your pet's chest rise and fall-this is one cycle.
- 3) Count the number of breaths for 30 seconds then multiply that number by 2.
- 4) Normal RR for dogs/cats is <u>less than 40 breaths/min</u>. Follow the trends in your pet. More important than the number are the trends. If you notice a <u>trending increase</u> (by 20%) in your pet's RR give your local or emergency veterinarian a call immediately.
